Pastor's Proposal on Worship Services


Over the past couple months Holy Cross leadership has been having some discussions regarding our Saturday evening 5:30pm worship service. It is difficult for a sole pastor like myself who has children and a spouse who works full time during the work week to not be around much on weekends (add to this Sunday night youth group and occasional Saturday morning or afternoon events and you can imagine the strain on my family time). Changes will have to be made to my schedule to better prioritize time with my family.

Over the past year we have tried some new ideas to try to increase Saturday worship attendance, but it remains in the 20s. We definitely have space for more people to attend our Sunday worship at 10:00am, and it would be great to all be together for worship. I created a long survey that we handed out to all those who are regular on Saturday night and received good feedback. There were some responses that said they might consider switching to Sunday if there was an earlier or later worship option. As a result of this feedback we put out a Connection Card survey about offering a Sunday two-service option (8:30am & 10:45am or 8:45am & 11:00am) and received good feedback. We continue to have discussions at the Elder and Council meetings regarding all of this.

As pastor of Holy Cross my concern is that we don't lose anyone to worship time & day changes, or as little as possible, although I know we can't fulfill everyone's preferences. Another solution would be to add a regular midweek worship service on Wednesday evenings (we already do this in Advent and Lent) to complement a one Sunday worship at 10:00am.

There are many factors to consider in all this, such as the current music and liturgical differences between Saturday and Sunday worship and bible study opportunities, choir and handbells etc. In the next month the Elders and Council will be making decisions regarding these questions and if you have feedback that you haven't offered yet you can email me or put a note in my mailbox. Thank you for your patience and understanding in all this. Join us in praying for wisdom from God and seeking his will together for the Glory of Jesus Christ.

NEW HOPE FOOD PANTRY



For the month of May New Hope Food Pantry served 83 families, 290 people, and gave 84 units. We gave out 14 Bibles and 10 packages of diapers. The year to date totals through May are: 220 families, 749 people, 221 units, 19 Bibles and 22 Packages of diapers.

We have been very busy these days with many needy people. The United States Postal Service had their annual food drive and we were very fortunate to receive thousands of pounds of nonperish-

ables dropped off at our pantry door. Thank you to all of the church members who just happened to be there and carry it all in. Both tables and under both tables were packed with bags and boxes and the shopping carts and the flat bed was also full.

We still hope someone will step up in the months ahead to lend a SUV, car or a truck or drive to the warehouse themselves to pick up additional food, bread, fresh produce and meat. Please contact Joanne Vollbrecht if you are available any 1st or third Wednesday morning of the month. You may select the date of your choice. The warehouse is near Groesbeck and Hall Road and the workers there will do all the lifting and loading of the food. All that we need are drivers on one day.

Do you have old eyeglasses that you are no longer wearing? How about those empty ink cartridges that you are hanging on to, or and old tattered or torn American flag? Or how about the Canadian coins that you are saving? What to do with all these items. I am working with some area Lutheran Churches to collect these items. So, beginning in July I will have a box in the office that I will be collecting old eyeglasses, empty ink cartridges, used American flags and Canadian coins. We are calling it The Collection Closet.

Here is what is going to happen with the items that are collected. Once the box is full I will be dropping it off at the host church and they in turn will distribute the items to the appropriate place.

Eyeglasses: A Vision of Compassion

Each year, MOST Ministries provides recycled eyeglasses to people living in the developing nations around the world. Generous individuals, churches and organizations across the US. collect and send used eyeglasses to MOST Ministries, where they are then sorted, tested and repackaged by volunteers for distribution on the mission field by our team members.

The cost of a pair of glasses in many developing nations can exceed a month's salary. Without assistance from MOST Ministries, hundreds of thousands of people would go without the glasses they need to work, read or attend school. MOST Ministries often provides the only pair of eyeglasses a person will ever own.

Empty Ink Cartridges: A Colorful Contribution

In another corner, a pile of empty ink cartridges awaits its transformation. While these small plastic containers might seem insignificant, their collection in the closet reflects a commitment to responsible e-waste disposal. Ink cartridges are notorious for their environmental impact, but the Collection Closet ensures they find new life. The Collection Closet benefits from the recycling program, receiving cash for every cartridge collected. This extra funding supports operating expenses and other outreach programs.

Used American Flags: Honoring the Stars and Stripes

A particularly moving aspect of the Collection Closet is its dedication to the respectful disposal of used American flags. Old, tattered, or torn flags, which might otherwise be forgotten or discarded, are collected here with reverence. Scouts and Knights of Columbus ensure that each flag is properly retired according to the United States Flag Code. This process involves a ceremonial burning, conducted in a solemn and respectful manner. The Collection Closet invites residents to bring in their worn flags, ensuring that these symbols of our nation are honored to the very end.

Canadian Coins: Supporting Lutheran Churches

The Collection Closet also serves as a repository for spare Canadian coins. Donate your leftover Canadian change, which accumulates over time. Once the piggy bank is full, the collected coins will be given to a Lutheran Church in Canada, fostering a spirit of generosity and cross-border support.
